King's College Hospital

T&O Services at King's

King's at Denmark Hill is one of the 4 Level 1 Major Trauma Centres within London, the regional referral centre for most of complex elective upper limb lower limb orthopaedics and has a well-established tertiary referral service for the other sub-speciality areas including Limb Reconstruction, Paediatrics and Complex Upper Limb.

Princess Royal University Hospital (PRUH) provides orthopaedic services in Bromley borough area. PRUH provides routine trauma care that consists predominantly of fragility fractures and low energy trauma.

Orpington hospital has an Elective Orthopaedic Centre where most of the trust's elective orthopaedic work is done. This centre is responsible for the second highest number of elective orthopaedic procedures in London and a large number of arthroplasty procedures are performed at this facility.

The Offer

Applications are invited for the International Fellow in Trauma & Orthopaedics, ST3 level post. The successful candidates will rotate between the 3 Kings Sites offering T&O services, on a 24 month fixed-term contract. The first year will be at a senior resident level, consisting of attending clinics, operating theatres and ward care. All trainees will have the opportunity to progress to senior level during the second year of their fellowship, depending on the trainees' commitment, development and engagement.

You will:

- Work with a highly skilled multidisciplinary team of experienced specialists that encourages clinical excellence and high standards of care to a diverse community of patients and their families.
- Be provided with education, development and training opportunities
- Be part of a department with an active research portfolio that runs a number of national/international research projects of which some fellows are asked to participate in.
